

Saved to Serve

We recently spent some time together studying Ephesians 2:8-10, examining the relationship between our faith and works (*acts of service*). We saw that we are saved by God's grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone. We had nothing to do with our salvation; it was a gift from God.

However, Paul does tell us that we are God's masterpieces, saved with a purpose in mind ... to do good works. Put another way, salvation should lead to good works but good works DO NOT lead to salvation. Our good works are a natural outgrowth of God's work in our lives.

Here at Redeemer Bible Church, acts of service equate to the SERVE step along the discipleship pathway. This pathway — *consisting of WORSHIP, CONNECT, and SERVE* — represents the "basics" of how we go about maturing as a disciple of Christ.

So, maturing disciples SERVE others, tangibly demonstrating the love of Christ and helping them grow. In God's economy, engaging in service to others helps us grow too! Thus, it's important that we seek out SERVE opportunities and dive in! At RBC, we SERVE others through in-reach (serving church members), neighborhood outreach, as well as local and global missions (serving cross-culturally).

This issue of the *Link* focuses on ways we, as a body, are impacting one another, our community, and world through acts of service. But we need you to be involved, too (assuming you're not already)! So, you'll also find a list of service opportunities. Find one that interests you and get started! You'll not only be a blessing to others but also find a new source of joy and satisfaction. To paraphrase the words of Paul, "We are NOT saved by our good works but we are saved to DO good works!"

The student ministry of RBC spent the weekend at the Church for our inaugural *Serve's Up* event on March 8.

We joined together in fellowship, worship and service with more than 50 members of our church family ranging in age from 6 to 80 years old. We sent people to Our Calling, a homeless outreach ministry in Dallas; Genesis Women's Shelter, a thrift store that supports the ministry to battered women and children; and White Rock Center of Hope, a ministry providing clothes, food and other assistance to the needy in our community.

We also hosted a free random-act-of-kindness car wash in the church's parking lot, while inviting people into the church and handing out invitations to celebrate Easter with us. One young man from the community whose Jeep we washed was rejuvenated after having a rough week. He said, "I really needed a blessing this week!" Gene Burrows, who led the group sent to Our Calling said,

"If you want your eyes opened to the true impact of homelessness in our city, go on a search and rescue operation with Our Calling. You will probably wind up in your own neighborhood!"

And on *Serve's Up* Sunday, we took a special offering to help one of our missionaries, Kristen Raikes, get a car to better serve in the rural areas of Thailand.

We are saved to serve and we pray that we may continue to seek opportunities to do so throughout the year!





Serving in Hungary: The Kadar Family

Recently, our church had the privilege of hosting the Kadar family, our missionaries from Word of Life (WOL) Hungary. On Feb. 2, Laci shared from God's Word, and told about their ongoing teaching and camping ministry to the youth in Hungary and Central Europe.

As camp director and Bible teacher,

he oversees a ministry where over 1,100 young people come to the beautiful 740-plus acre facility to hear the Gospel and receive discipling as they begin to grow in Christ. The campers also learn English and participate in baseball and other sports during their stay.

Every summer, the Kadars enthusiastically welcome short-term missionary groups from Redeemer, who come and help teach English, sports and participate in needed construction and updating the property. In 2003, Blake Barbre and Jerry Loveless led the first group of 26 people from Redeemer to Hungary and join in this exciting ministry. This began an annual pilgrimage, and for the past 10 years over 200 RBC members have gone to be involved in this dynamic ministry.

Janet Ramler, who has gone each year and now leads the effort, said: "Laci's passion for the youth of his country is shown in the way he presents the Gospel to them! In the evening, everyone in the camp gathers to pray, sing and hear Laci preach. There are always many campers whose hearts are drawn to Christ. It is powerful."

Every spring, Redeemer has a huge, church-wide garage sale, and the proceeds help to fund these summer mission trips to Hungary. Meet Our Worship Pastor

God has recently blessed Redeemer with a muchanticipated and long-awaited pastor of worship, Kendall Carter. He and his wife, Jessica, native Texans, received Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Arts and Music degrees, respectively, from Hardin Simmons University. They met at the University in 1999, where their love story began, and married in Dallas, on July 13, 2003. Ten years later, God blessed them with a beautiful daughter, Julia Anne, who celebrated her first birthday on Feb. 11.

Kendall also earned a Master of Music degree in choral conducting from the University of North Texas, and Jessica received a Master of Science degree in speech therapy from the University of Texas at Dallas.

Kendall has been involved in church music ministry for more than 15 years, and he currently directs the Frisco

Chorale. Jessica is a bilingual speech language pathologist for the Plano school district and a lecturer in speech language pathology at the Callier Center.

Both Kendall and Jessica received Christ as their savior as children. "Our childhood teaching and mentoring took place in Baptist churches, but neither of us cling to a denominational adherence," Kendall said. "We define ourselves as Christians!"

The *Link* asked Kendall to answer a few questions about his ministry:

How has God used your previous experience to prepare you for RBC?

I developed a strong appreciation for traditional and contemporary forms of music and worship at my home church, which had a particularly rich and vibrant music ministry. I was heavily involved in a volunteer capacity. My first full-time service, as the minister of music, was very much akin to RBC in terms of music traditions and style. Thus, I am excited to continue in this realm while also enjoying the adventures of newly composed music. Since completing my graduate work, I have served in more traditional music/worship-style churches. These experiences have educated me vastly – particularly as related to historical sacred music development.



Where do you see worship going at Redeemer over the next few years?

I see our worship/music currently and in the future as a splendid combination of new songs and hymns, offered to the Lord with excellence and beauty. I also foresee that we will never neglect the meaningful traditions and hymns from the past, which point our minds and hearts to God.

What drew you to Redeemer Bible Church?

I found both a peace and an excitement regarding the ways God might use me in service at RBC. I believe we are well-stationed to reach people with the Gospel message, and our church leadership is diligently doing the work of the Lord. On an occupational note, I am very pleased with the fine musicianship exhibited through our music leaders. RBC is blessed with immense music talent, and this makes my tasks unbelievably enjoyable!
