
Connect Pastor, Bert Howard, estimates that only 40 percent of Redeemer's members and regular attenders are regularly participating in a Connect Community.

In a culture that isolates and denigrates men, the Men of Redeemer are hungry for a different kind of manhood.



Our librarian, Hazel Sage, and other committed Biblebelieving members of the church help screen every resource that comes into Redeemer's library.

There are over 6,000 books and media resources in the library, including:

- · Adult fiction, non-fiction, and biography
- Youth fiction and non-fiction
- Children's and juniors' fiction, non-fiction, and biography
- CDs and DVDs

The library even has commentaries for small-group leaders and seminary students, as well as resources for homeschooling families. Take advice from Katherine: "Sometimes reading gets you out of things, like building a fence," and start your Fall off right by learning something new or escape into a good book. Laura graduated from high school in 2004. She earned a bachelor's degree in Communication Sciences, speech therapy track, from Texas Woman's University in 2011.

"Recently, I became a licensed assistant in speech-language pathology, which prepared me to help children and adults with their communication challenges, including articulation, fluency, voice issues, grammar, vocabulary and social skills," she said. Laura has served as a nanny and tutor for a family with five children for the past seven years. "It has been a joy and pleasure to help raise and educate these children," she said. While seeking further work and volunteer opportunities in the speech therapy field, she has also been a caregiver for an Alzheimer's patient.

Laura became a believer when she was 4 years old, realizing at an early age that she needed Jesus as her Savior. She attributes learning basic spiritual principles to her involvement with mid-week church children's clubs, where she was taught the value of reading and memorizing Scripture.

"During my 2004 trip to Word of Life, in Hungary, I was with believers from another part of the world, and experienced deeper spiritual discovery. It challenged me to explore my faith and be more honest regarding the struggles that come," she said.

"Most recently, I have been challenged in my walk by the health crisis with my mother," she said. "I know I am a different and better person because we have experienced this. I have a better understanding that the Lord does not promise us a pain-free journey. Consequently, I seek Him as the answer and look forward to heaven more eagerly! We are ever grateful for the support given to our family during this time and over the years."
