# **Getting Started**

- What does/did your relationship with your earthly father look like? How would you describe it?
- How has that relationship influenced your relationship with your heavenly Father? Specifically, how has that impacted the way you pray/talk to God?

## **Static Questions**

#### WHAT IS THE PASSAGE ABOUT?

- Note the key details (Who, What, When, Where, Why, etc.)
- Pay attention to the main *Facts* of the passage.

#### WHAT DID YOU LEARN?

- What does the passage reveal about God? About people?
- Is there a promise or a command or a warning?
- What is the main truth of the passage?
- What lessons do you see?

#### **HOW WILL YOU APPLY IT?**

- How does this passage relate to your life right now?
- What change in your thinking or behavior is needed to align with the truths in this passage?
- How should you respond based on what you learned?

## From the Teaching this Morning

- In Ephesians 3:14-21, Paul mentions that he prays to God for the Ephesian believers. Joel mentioned three things in particular that Paul prays for here. What are those three things?
- In Ephesians 3:17, Paul says that he desires to see that "Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith." What does it mean to have Christ dwell in our hearts through faith?
- Joel mentioned the paradox that as much as we know the love of Christ, there is always so much
  more we still have to learn it's beyond our human comprehension. How have you been
  amazed recently by the love of Christ? How have you experienced it in a newer or deeper way?
- Read Ephesians 3:20-21. What does this passage say about who God is? How does that impact our understanding of prayer?
- What would it look like for us as individuals and for us as a church to "be filled with all the fullness of God?" What needs to change in order for us to display this fullness even more?
