Getting Started

• Is there someone from your past (or present) who modeled well what it is to seek contentment in Christ above all else? What kind of an impact did this person have on your own life?

Static Questions

- What was the passage about?
 - o Note the key details (Who, What, When, Where, Why, etc.)
 - o Pay attention to the main *points* of the passage.
- What did you learn?
 - O What did the passage reveal about God? About people?
 - O Was there a promise or command or a warning?
 - O What is the big idea of the passage?
 - O What lessons do you see?
- How will you apply it?
 - o How does this passage relate to your life right now?
 - o What change in your thinking or behavior is needed to align with the truths in this message?
 - o How should you respond based on what you learned?

From the Teaching this Morning

- Is there anything that stood out to you from this morning's message?
- What are things the Church in America in 2020 are tempted to place our contentment in? How has falling into these temptations hurt the Church in the past?
- Are the any "thorns" the Lord has used in your own life that served as opportunities for the Lord to demonstrate his strength through your weakness?

Application Questions

- This Thanksgiving, take time to be still and give thanks to the one from whom every good and perfect gift is received. Ask Him for the grace to not seek contentment in those gifts but to enjoy them in the manner for which God gave them. I pray you all have a very Happy Thanksgiving.
- Take time to read Psalm 73 (especially vs 23-26) this week. Pray and reflect over it as a reminder of whom we are to seek our contentment in.
